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2019 was Successful Year for DCC Art Department

The Dawson Community College Art Department is celebrating several accomplishments in 2019.

In March, the Art Department held the Native Voices Exhibition, which showcased the works of Native American artists from across Montana. Several of the artists were on hand to talk about their work at the exhibition opening.

"We are very pleased about the success of the *Native Voices* Exhibition and hope to hold it again on a rotating basis," said DCC Art Department Director and Exhibition Curator Jennifer Wheeler.

Kylee Stump, one of the DCC studentartists featured in Native Voices, sold one of her paintings during the exhibition. Additionally, one of Stump's art pieces from DCC's Illustration course was selected by the Glendive Public Library to represent the 2019 Summer Reading Program's theme A Galaxy of Books. Stump sold the rights to her work, G is for Galaxy, to the library, and the illustration graced all marketing and printed material for the Summer Reading Program.

"The Art Department and the Glendive Public Library have decided to work together to use student art for this event each year," said Wheeler. "Students in the upcoming Spring 2020 Illustration course will be asked to create artwork to represent 2020's Summer Reading Program theme Imagine Your Story."

The library plans to kick off their program with a medieval fair with a

huge cardboard castle, which may influence art designs.

Wheeler was also pleased by the reception the DCC Art Department Christmas Card Contest received. This was the second year for the contest, and the student-designed Christmas cards completely sold out.

The design by DCC Art major Angela Therrien was the winner of the Grand Prize - the work chosen by President Mickelsen - and the arwork receiving the most public votes.

This was the first year DCC offered online public voting through the College's website. Many community members and campus faculty, staff, administration, and students cast their votes for the top artwork. This will now be an annual event.

The Christmas Card Contest was one of three exhibitions held during the Fall 2019 semester. Others included the Bell Street Bridge Exhibition and the Fabricated Facades Exhibition, which featured monumental fantasy masks and bug designs made from recycled materials.

Developed in 1991, BQA is a national program that raises consumer confidence through offering proper management techniques and a commitment to quality within every segment of the beef industry. The voluntary certification program provides the U.S. beef industry with a consistent set of animal welfare standards and best practices. The BQA program is nationally coordinated by the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA), a contractor to the Beef Checkoff.

According to the Beef Quality Assurance website, www.bqa.org, more than 85% of the beef supply in the U.S. comes from farms and ranches that adhere to BQA standards and guidelines, with the number increasing monthly.

"BQA Certification is valuable for our students as it shows their commitment to constant quality assurance and improvement to the beef industry. The certification will serve them well in their future endeavors," said Carrier.

Hitt, from Malta, Idaho; Davis, from Helena; and Peterson, from Glentworth, Saskatchewan are the first DCC students to ever earn BQA Certification. Each is scheduled to graduate from DCC in Spring 2020 with degrees in Animal Science.
