What does it $\,$ Mean to be Culturally Responsive - Dr. Shamani Shikwambi, Dean of Academics, DCC $\,$

In this session, we will address the intersectionality of culture and learning. Culture is central to learning. It plays a role not only in communicating and receiving information , but also in shaping the thinking process of groups and individuals. A pedagogy that acknowledges, responds to, and celebrates fundamental cultures offers full, equitable access to education for students from all cultures.

Mindset Matters-Sarah North Wolfe, Interim Dean of Enrollment, DCC

This session will provide an overview of research regarding implicit theories of intelligence and discuss methods for fostering a growth mindset in students through everyday interactions. By mindfully guiding students toward a more growth mindset-based approach to challenges, educators can encourage resilience and enrich students' educational experiences. This presentation will give examples of how growth mindset "interventions" can be incorporated into one-on-one meetings and in the classroom.

Introduction to Online Teaching with Technology - Jennifer Weeding, Instructor of Mathematics, DCC

Dual Enrollment - Amy Williams, Executive Director for National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships, (NACEP)

Enjoy this rare opportunity to connect with one of the foremost national experts on the field of dual enrollment, Amy Williams, who also led Montana's work to build and then expand the program from a few hundred students to the thousands that participate today. Learn about why these programs matter and are so popular, what constitutes a quality program, what teachers can and should expect from the experience, where the challenges lay for the nation and Montana, as well as the impact of the pandemic on program structure and function. *Teaching Remotely: Options to Support K-12 Educators - SPARK Teaching Group

In this two day session, held virtually, K-12 Educators will be provided with support facing uncertainties in the upcoming school years, help prepare for classroom and virtual teaching environments, and to bolster skill in engaging teaching practices in any content.

*Mythical and Magical Creatures in Art History - Jen Wheeler, Instructor of Arts. DCC

In this full day workshop, the morning session will cover an Art History lesson and class discussion regarding Mythical and Magical creatures in Art History. The approach will be Global/Multicultural and will cover Historical and Mythical arenas. This course will be delivered fully online or in-person — proving how flexible the subject matter is if COVID-19 makes fully online or hybrid delivery necessary. Content can be adapted to several of the anchor standards across K-12 grade levels. Content can also be used as part of a cross-curriculum unit on Mythology, History, or Art History.

1:00 to 4:30 p.m. Session

*Mythical and Magical Creatures in Art History - Jen Wheeler, Instructor of Arts, DCC

The afternoon session will be a hands-on studio unit based on the lecture learning. We will focus on building a 3D creature which will include elements from several of the creatures we learned about. We will also discuss physical distancing, ways to avoid cross contamination of supplies, kinds of supplies to enhance equity, and ways to view finished works, including online methods. Afternoon session will culminate in a Finished Written Lesson Plan for online participants, or Presentation of Lesson Plan for those who are inperson.
